Reading (Reading)

<p>I hope you will visit me one day. (I hope you will visit me one day.)</p>	<p>I think your sister will like that cellphone. (I think your sister will like that cellphone.)</p>
<p>Johnny will be 25 next Sunday. (Johnny will be 25 next Sunday.)</p>	<p>I will/ I'll call a taxi for you. (I will/ I'll call a taxi for you.)</p>

<p>The prime minister will serve for four years. (The prime minister will serve for four years.)</p>	<p>Our manager will be very happy. (Our manager will be very happy.)</p>
<p>I will/ I'll buy you a new phone. (I will/ I'll buy you a new phone.)</p>	<p>I will/ I'll call you as soon as possible. (I will/ I'll call you as soon as possible.)</p>
<p>What would you like to eat? I will/ I'll have pizza. (What would you like to eat? I will/ I'll have pizza.)</p>	<p>I will/ I'll be back in a moment! (I will/ I'll be back in a moment!)</p>
<p>I won't (will not) do it. I'm already tired. (I won't (will not) do it. I'm already tired.)</p>	<p>We won't (will not) eat here anymore. (We won't (will not) eat here anymore.)</p>

Grammar focus (Grammar focus)

- ❖ Use “will” to talk about an action that we believe or think will happen in the future.
E.g.) I think you will like it. (I think you will like it.)

- ❖ Will is also used for the things we decide to do now.
E.g.) I will call you a taxi. (I will call you a taxi.)

- ❖ Will is also used when you ask somebody to do something.
E.g.) Will you please turn down the music volume? (Will you please turn down the music volume?)

- ❖ We also use will to make offers and promises.
E.g.) I will do my best to help you. (I will do my best to help you.)

- ❖ Use “will not” or “won’t” (abbreviation of “will not”) when you make negative sentences with “will.”
E.g.) I will not be in the office tomorrow. (I will not be in the office tomorrow.)
They will not stay here. (They will not stay here.)

Note: Will is a modal verb and it does not change in the third person (he, she, it).
